

# A MESSAGE FROM DEACON DAN GOSHEY

May the peace of the Lord be with you always

This November, I will celebrate the eighth anniversary of receiving the Sacrament of Holy Orders having been ordained a deacon in 2017. In 2022 I was appointed the Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate. As the director, I have the opportunity to walk with and care for deacons in our diocese. I have the honor of being a servant to the servants, and I love my job! In addition, I am responsible for the training of other men and their wives who are discerning the vocation of being a deacon and the wife of a deacon. Right now, we have 23 couples going through the formation process, with a handful of others possibly ready to begin or continue next year. I can't tell you how extraordinary that is, and the timing couldn't be better.

Thirty-five years ago, in 1990, our diocese had 66 active (non-retired) priests and 11 deacons. Today we have about 34 active priests and about 50 active deacons. While there is a more intentional effort being made now to invite more men to consider entering seminary for a potential priesthood vocation, there is also an effort to invite more men to consider the diaconate as well. That's what I want to talk about in the remainder of this article.

Whenever I visit with a man and his wife as they ponder the diaconate, there are four hurdles or objections they will often have:

**Objection 1:** I am already so busy, how could I add this to my schedule? I have seen what deacons do and I can't possibly take that on.

Response: First, you should not compare yourself to another deacon. We don't need you to do what that other guy is doing. He is already doing it. We need you to be what God created you to be and serve in that way. Second, is your life busy doing what GOD is asking you to do, or what YOU think you should be doing? It could be that you are doing wonderful and charitable things, but God is asking something different from you. If you gave God your "to do" list, what would He cross off, and what would He add?

**Objection 2:** I have young kids at home, and I need to be present for them. **Response:** As a deacon, your most important parishioners are your wife and kids. They MUST come first. Being a deacon should not make you absent from them, but more fully present... living with them and loving them as a member of the clergy with the additional grace of the sacrament of Holy Orders.

Objection 3: I am not smart enough or a good enough person.

**Response:** You're right. You are not smart enough or good enough...but God is. He formed dust from nothing, and formed man from dust, and He can turn bread into Himself... surely, He can form you into a deacon if that is His plan for you.

Objection 4: How do I know if God is actually calling me?

**Response:** The only way to know if God is calling you, is to begin the discernment process. Discernment isn't thinking, praying or talking about it. Discernment is taking steps in that direction - with guidance. We will help you discover the answer.

**The next step:** Pray. When we pray the Vocation Prayer at Mass, we ask God for the grace to "encourage and foster" vocations. Is there someone you know who you think should consider discerning the diaconate? Is it your friend? Your brother? Your son or son-in-law? Your husband?

Speak to him about it. Often God's call comes through others around us.

If you have felt a nudge yourself, but aren't sure what to do with it, or don't know if it is really God or your own imagination, let's talk. Speak to me or another deacon. Speak to your pastor. You'll never get anywhere just keeping it inside and wondering.

You might also be wondering whether we even need any more deacons. Yes. If God is calling you, there is a need for you. Do you have more questions? Let's talk. You can call or text me at 218-316-0607




